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ABOUT THE PROGRAM

OCYS STRING ENSEMBLE

Brandenburg Concerto No. 3

J.S. Bach wrote six Brandenburg Concertos on behalf of Christian Ludwig, the Margrave of Brandenburg-Schwedt in Germany. These concertos played a critical role in the development of chamber music in the late Baroque era, and continue to live on in string orchestra repertoire. Concertos commonly have solo instruments accompanied by an ensemble, but Bach had the idea of using different sections of the orchestra to pass around the soloistic role.

Gabriel's Oboe

Gabriel's Oboe originates from the 1986 movie The Mission and has since become a popular tune in the world of film scoring. The soundtrack received a Golden Globe for Best Original Score, and Gabriel's Oboe was highly praised. Many arrangements have been written for various solo instruments to pay homage to the beautiful melody.

Capriol Suite for String Orchestra

A very large majority of Peter Warlock's compositions are songs and choral pieces. The Capriol Suite is one of very few of his instrumental works and was originally arranged for two pianos and later written for string orchestra. This suite of Renaissance dances evokes various styles, with the "Basse-Danse" being heavy and the "Mattachins" sword dance energetic and playful.

OCYS WINDS AND PERCUSSION

Blue Ridge Reel

Reminiscent of the Blue Ridge Mountains in the eastern United States, the composition brings various styles from the region together including a reel, Dixieland jazz, and bluegrass.

OCYS ORCHESTRA

On Top of the World

The driving energy of this piece evokes constant triumph and jubilance to express the feelings of being 'on top of the world.'

OCYS STRING ENSEMBLE

Divertimento in F Major, K. 138

Composed at the age of 16, Mozart wrote a total of three divertimentos with the Divertimento in F major being the last of the three. They were written while travelling to Italy with his father, who was a court musician. After returning to Salzburg, the divertimentos were performed at festive gatherings to show Mozart's gift of composing at such a young age.

"Finale" from St. Paul's Suite

During adulthood and up until the end of his life, Gustav Holst served as the musical director of the St. Paul's Girls' School in London. He wrote many pieces for the school musicians to perform and decided to name this suite after the school. The Finale of the suite, subtitled "The Dargason", is also most famously heard in Holst's Second Suite in F for Military Band. It highlights both themes of the folk tune "Dargason" and recognizable melodies from "Greensleeves."

"Dashing Away" from Suite for Strings

John Rutter is best known for his contributions to choral music, yet the Suite for Strings remains prominent in his oeuvre as well as standard string orchestra repertoire. Each movement of the suite highlights British folk songs, with contrasting moods of lyrical melodies and energetic drive. The last movement, "Dashing Away" [with a Smoothing Iron], is a traditional English folk song about a woman who is in the process of organizing her clothes for the day.

ORANGE COUNTY YOUTH SYMPHONY

Founded in 1970, the Orange County Youth Symphony (OCYS) is the official youth orchestra of Orange County. As an honor ensemble, OCYS requires all accepted musicians to participate in their year-round respective school string, band, or orchestral programs. Participation in OCYS reinforces school ensembles by providing additional musical opportunities to top-performing young musicians in Orange County.

With its commitment to excellence, OCYS has performed at major music conferences throughout the United States and has toured Europe and Asia to critical acclaim. In 2012, OCYS was the winner of the American Prize in Orchestral Performance—Youth Orchestra Division. Deemed "the real thing" by *The Los Angeles Times*, OCYS is now led by Music Director and conductor Johannes Müller Stosch.

In the summer of 2013, OCYS toured the United Kingdom and attended the famed Proms Concerts as guests of the Royal Philharmonic Society. Representing Orange County's best young adult musicians, OCYS performances have been lauded by both critics and audiences throughout the United States, Austria, China, Germany, Hong Kong, Italy, Japan, Spain, Switzerland, and the United Kingdom, among others.

In May 2014, OCYS was presented by the Philharmonic Society of Orange County to a sold-out Renée and Henry Segerstrom Concert Hall in a performance that included Beethoven's ninth Symphony and the West Coast premiere of Mark-Anthony Turnage's "Frieze." This concert was selected by both *The Orange County Register* and *The Los Angeles Times* as top picks during the 2013-14 season and was later broadcast on *PBS SoCal*.

OCYS additionally serves to support and supplement music programs across the county. Presented in longtime partnership with the Philharmonic Society of Orange County, the annual Concerts for Fifth Grade series has impacted hundreds of thousands of students since the 1980s. OCYS recently began inviting select high school programs to jointly perform in its season finale concert, doubling the size of each ensemble and providing new platforms for access and inspiration to all students. In the past three years, the orchestra has included Beckman, Tesoro, and Diamond Bar High Schools.

JOHANNES MÜLLER STOSCH, MUSIC DIRECTOR/CONDUCTOR



Currently, Johannes Müller Stosch serves as Director of Orchestral Activities at the Bob Cole Conservatory of Music at California State University, Long Beach, as well as Music Director and Conductor of Holland Symphony Orchestra in Michigan. He has also held conducting positions with the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra, the Brockport Symphony in New York, Tri State Players in Ohio, and

served repeatedly on the conducting and coaching staff at the Opera Theatre Festival in Lucca, Italy.

Müller Stosch keeps an active guest-conducting schedule both internationally and nationally, with recent engagements including concerts with Long Beach Symphony, Kunming Philharmonic in China, University Symphonies in Vancouver, Canada, and at the University of Oregon in Eugene. In 2009, he was a featured guest conductor with the Busan Sinfonietta in Korea in a concert that was broadcast on national TV (KBS).

An avid operatic conductor, he previously served as Music Director of the Museumsinsel-Operafestival in Berlin, Germany; has frequently guest conducted new opera productions at Cincinnati's famous College-Conservatory of Music; and worked repeatedly as visiting opera conductor at the Opera Theater at Webster University in St. Louis, Missouri. Aside from his passion for conducting, Müller Stosch has a special interest in performance practice and early music. In Germany, he worked with Hannover's L'Arco, Bremer Ratsmusik, and Concerto Brandenburg. He also frequently appears on organ and harpsichord with the Pacific Symphony. Concert tours as a soloist and collaborative artist have taken him throughout the U.S., Germany, Italy, Chile, and Japan. Müller Stosch has several commercial recordings to his credit all of which have been played on public radio.

Maestro Müller Stosch received his Doctorate of Musical Arts in Conducting from the Eastman School of Music. After winning the coveted Strader Organ Competition in Cincinnati, Ohio, he received two Master of Music degrees in organ performance and orchestral conducting from the Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music.

CATHY OLINGER, CONDUCTOR ORANGE COUNTY YOUTH STRING ENSEMBLE



Cathy Olinger received her Bachelor of Music degree with Graduate work at California State University, Long Beach. She has taught all levels of instrumental and choral music. As the founding Director of Instrumental Music program at Tesoro High School in the Capistrano Unified School District, she developed a

comprehensive Music Department with more than 500 students enrolled in the music department. In 2015, Tesoro High School

was recognized as a GRAMMY Signature School for its consistent level of excellence in all facets of its music program, making it one of only five high school programs nationwide to receive the award.

Mrs. Olinger has served as a guest conductor, clinician and adjudicator throughout California. She was honored to conduct the All Southern California Middle School (SCSBOA) Honor Orchestra Conductor in 1999 and 2015 and is currently serving as a Vice President on the board of directors for the Southern California School Band and Orchestra Association—one of the largest regional music organization in California.

She has been recognized as an Educator of the Year for the California League of High Schools, a recipient of the Irene Schoepfle Award for distinguished contributions in Orange County Music Education, and the Encore Award for outstanding achievement in Music Education. Most recently, she received the SCSBOA Honorary Life Membership.

Currently, Mrs. Olinger works at CSULB in the music education department as a student teacher supervisor and instructor for instrument methods classes. From working with the finest ensembles on the west coast to one-on-one coaching in the classroom, Mrs. Olinger sets high standards for achievement and musical excellence. She is a passionate advocate of music education who provides opportunity for students to develop an appreciation of music with the skills and discipline necessary for achieving musical success throughout a lifetime of experiences.

DANIELLE CULHANE, OPERATIONS & PERSONNEL MANAGER



Danielle Culhane received her Bachelor of Music and M.A. in Education from Vanguard University. She currently is the director of band and orchestra at Paramount Park Middle School, Paramount and has been the Operations & Personnel Manager for the Orange County Youth Symphony for over ten years. Danielle has traveled throughout

Europe with OCYS as a manager, performer, and passionate music educator who instills the knowledge and value of music for every student. She has been recognized as Teacher of the Year 2017-2018 for her school site as well as for the Paramount Unified School District.

Ms. Culhane believes music education provides an opportunity for students to develop an appreciation for music and encourages the skills and discipline necessary for achieving musical success throughout a lifetime of experiences. Students learn the importance of a cooperative team effort while working with fellow members to accomplish the shared goals.
