A special highlight of the season is the 25th anniversary of the Laguna Beach Music Festival, a multi-concert weekend that reflects our long-standing commitment to artistic excellence, collaboration, and community. A plethora of past artistic directors and collaborators join together to celebrate this momentous occasion!

Together with our continued diverse offerings, these concerts set the stage for a season filled with discovery, inspiration, and heart-stopping musical wonder. This concert season embodies the essence of what we all wish to experience together—world-class music at its very best.



And the music continues to play beyond our concerts and field trips, with the Strike Up the Band grant providing instruments and materials to school music programs.






